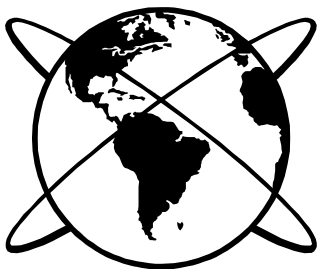

C-119 Returns to Hagerstown This Sunday

The C-119 is ready to fly! The Hagerstown arrival is planned for November 16! A propeller hub oil leak caused a delay in the plane's departure from Greybull, Wyoming. After taxi tests on Friday, October 31, an additional oil leak was found on the No. 1 engine. During the week of November 3 the complete propeller was removed and repaired and the engine and taxi tests were conducted, with positive results! The oil leak is fixed, and the plane's ready to fly. Depending on the weather, pilot Frank Lamm is planning to fly out of Greybull, Wyoming, early the week of November 10 to Ottumwa, Iowa, then fly on to Warrenton, Virginia, by Friday, November 14. The final flight to Hagerstown will be on Sunday, November 16 between 12:00 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. To check for further updates on the C-119's arrival in Hagerstown, visit www.HagerstownAviationMuseum.org or call the museum hotline at 301-733-8717.
