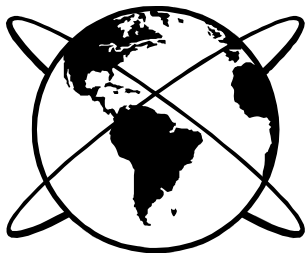

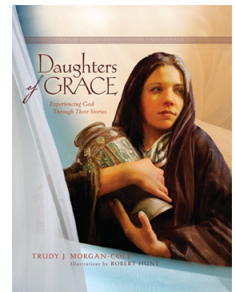
New Product Highlights

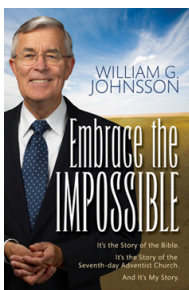


Title: **Embrace the Impossible**
