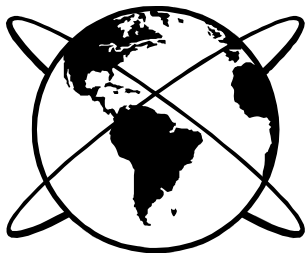

Hagerstown Aviation Museum

Spring is here, and the Hagerstown Aviation Museum is busy. An open house had been planned for May 3, but was postponed because of heavy rain forecast for that afternoon. Sunday, June 14, is the new date for the open house when the public can tour the C-119 Flying Boxcar. Many thanks to the members and donors who contributed to the repair of this special plane. In the midst of dropping temperatures and howling winds the C-119 returned home last November. Hundreds of people showed up to watch the historic return and landing, even though it was not a very pleasant day to be outside.

The museum offers a commemorative DVD for sale, *Fairchild C-119 Flying Boxcar—Hagerstown Homecoming*, and a new book, *Hagerstown During WWII*, as fund-raisers for the museum. The DVD captures the excitement of the five-day journey across the country with more than 100 minutes of video footage and still images. The book has more than 600 photographs of the Hagerstown homefront, depicting a time when the entire community worked together to win the war. The museum has received some fantastic media coverage recently. The April 2009 edition of *Air Classics* magazine features a story about the Hagerstown Aviation Museum. Also in April the Hagerstown Aviation Museum was featured in *Propliner*, a respected aviation magazine from Great Britain. Published quarterly in Wiltshire, England, the magazine enthusiastically featured the return of the C-82 and C-119, with more than four pages of text and photographs.
