The American Red Cross of Washington County offers first aid and CPR classes at 1131 Conrad Court, Hagerstown, Maryland. To register for any class, please call 301-739-0717, ext. 0 or visit www.redcrosswcmd.org.

◆ Standard First Aid with CPR/AED—Adult: learn rescue breathing, how to clear an obstructed airway, and how to perform one-rescuer CPR on victims 8 years of age or older. Course also includes basic first-aid skills, such as how to treat life-threatening bleeding, burns, musculoskeletal injuries, shock, and sudden illnesses. Length of course: 7 hours. Cost: \$45. Course dates are:

Monday, June 8, 2009, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Monday, July 13, 2009, 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

◆ CPR/AED—Adult: adult CPR deals with victims 8 years of age or older. This course covers all cardiac and breathing emergency skills, including how to perform rescue breathing, clear an obstructed airway, and perform one-rescuer CPR. Length of course: 4 hours. Cost: \$35. Course dates are:

Tuesday, July 7, 2009, 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

◆ Standard First Aid: trains participants to identify and care for victims of illness and sudden injuries. You will learn how to control bleeding, minimize the effects of shock, and care for musculoskeletal injuries and sudden illness as a result of poisoning and heat- and cold-related emergencies. Ideal for anyone who wants to learn basic first-aid skills but does not need rescue breathing or CPR training. Length of course: 4 hours. Cost: \$30. Course dates are:

Thursday, September 10, 2009, 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

◆ CPR/AED—Infant and Child: this course is indispensable for anyone who is in frequent contact with infants and small children. The course focuses on overcoming any reluctance to act in emergency situations and to recognize and care for life-threatening respiratory or cardiac emergencies in children under the age of 8. 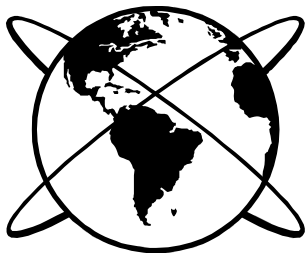

Gather a group of friends and set a time to walk or run each week. The commitment provides a built-in source of accountability and can make it more fun.



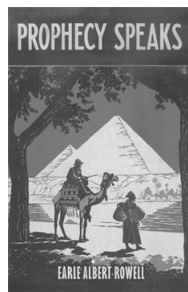
