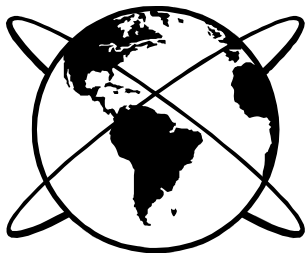

Sweeten Summer with Cool, Refreshing Smoothies

Warm summer days call for the perfect frosty refreshment. Try homemade fruit smoothies—sweetened naturally with pure honey. Here are some easy tips:

- ◆ Add variety: Experiment with different combinations of fresh fruits. Try melons, berries and tropical fruits such as mangoes, bananas and pineapple.

Title: **Mary: Call Me Blessed**

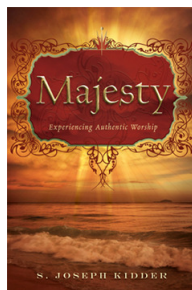
